President's Report

Hello Tiger Family! It gives me great pleasure to provide the President's report for the season. While the weather was again a little dicey, with the exception of the Colts who had a really bad run of luck and missed 7 of 18 games, most other teams managed to get out on the field regularly. We worked closely with Cricket ACT and ACT Sportgrounds to try our best to find grounds to play on. While it can be frustrating being confronted with long grass at the oval, the reality is that mowing can sometimes cause longer term damage and issues. Once the warmer weather arrived things improved quickly, so thank-you for your patience and support.

Our registered player numbers were down a little on last season. The committee made the difficult decision to raise our registration fees for the first time in a number of seasons – the reality is that we were not covering our costs, and the club needs to be strong financially otherwise we will not have a club. I'm confident that our fees will remain stable next season, particularly if we can secure further sponsorship.

This season we had Ginninderry sponsor our Woolworths Blast program. This program is a significant expense as we pay our junior coaches to run the sessions. This ensures we get committed resources that will turn up each session, supports our strategic plan of growing and developing our coaching capacity for the future, and maximises the learning for the Blast participants so they are ready to transition to Junior Format cricket in the coming seasons. Feedback from our Blast families has been extremely positive, and our aim is to improve on our Blast numbers next season to further grow the pipeline of the club's future. I'd like to take the opportunity to again thank Ginninderry for their sponsorship, and look forward to discussing future collaborations with them soon.

We also managed to secure a Grassroots Cricket fund grant. This grant helped to cover some our equipment expenses, particularly balls which is one of our main expenses. We'll aim to continue securing this grant in coming seasons, and explore what additional grants may be available that will take away some of the financial pressure that registration fees might cause.

Success on the field was limited this year again with no teams making the semi-finals. That said our teams play in some of the most challenging and competitive competitions within the ACT, and so it can be misleading – the vast majority of our teams are in the top level of the competition, competing against teams with significantly more resources and funding. Despite this we are often competitive, and as our Colts showed in the second half of the season a bit of belief and the team clicking will make our club as good as, if not better, than many other teams. We also had a number of junior players that played finals with the Senior teams in the Premier Cricket competition; congratulations to those junior players who won premierships with our 5th and 6th grade sides. Our junior players contribution to the senior sides is well recognised and appreciated, so well done!

One thing that I think truly differentiates us from the other teams is our spirit and values. I have observed some very poor winners and terrible losers over the course of the season, however the feedback I have received from other clubs is that Ginninderra is almost always gracious in defeat, and humble in victory. That is exactly the attitude I'm looking for, so well done to all for living up to our Tiger values.

Our Pink Stumps Day was a resounding success once again, where we again raised a record amount of \$1625. We were well supported by Cricket ACT who donated a signed Ashes bat, congratulations to Sam Lawton who won it – I still think he should have walked out to the middle and had a crack with it! Well done to everyone who helped us support the McGrath Foundation.

Our Bunnings BBQ was likewise a success. We made a profit of \$1994, which is \$200 more than last year, despite some inclement weather later in the day. So a massive thankyou to those who volunteered their time, and a special thankyou to Carl Fitzpatrick, who did a mammoth job organising, coordinating, setting and cleaning up, and spending the entire day at Bunnings.

The Toyota Good for Cricket Raffle is also a key fundraising initiative for our club. With minimal overhead for us, and with all sales coming to the club, it is an excellent opportunity to generate funds that is only limited by the tickets we sell. This year we raised just under \$1000, which is \$750 less than last year. This isn't too surprising within the context of increase registration fees and cost of living pressures. However, given the good result of the Bunnings BBQ, and the sponsorship from Ginninderry and Grassroots Cricket, we are well placed financially for the coming season.

We released a five year strategic plan at the start of last season, which aims to strengthen what is working well, and grow where we are have identified short falls. I look forward to working with the committee to continue progression of the plan.

I'd like to thank all members of the committee who work behind the scenes to ensure the club functions efficiently and effectively. We may be looking for replacements for some committee positions. I will be sending out an alert in early July for our Special General Meeting. If you are interested in supporting the club further by being part of the committee, please reach out and we can discuss. This coming season is likely to be my last as President, and it would be great to have the future president on the committee in the coming season to ensure a seamless transition for season 24/25.

To all the parents who came along to watch and cheer the team on, for getting the boys to and from training and matches and for all the little things, kind gestures etc this season a huge thank you from Coach Dean and I.

We would also like to say a big thank you to Eli Palmer (Aka Axe), Cooper Rushby, Lakshya Goel, Jack Dann (Aka JD) and Lachlan Ryan (Aka Scorpion) for stepping up when we needed players and for acquitting themselves with distinction during the season.

Our Team

<u>Affan Safi (Aka Farny)</u> – Resolute opening batter and wily spinner. Farny had an excellent season batting at the top of the order helping to see off potent opening attacks and taking the shine off the new ball. Able to play shots all around the ground with technical precision Farny was the teams most consistent batter and also the only player to go through the whole season without scoring a duck. Farny was also our only spin bowler and could vary his pace and bowl very economically.

Key Stats: Runs: 176, Ave: 12.57, High Score: 31 (no), Wickets: 4, Best Bowling: 2/27 from 5 overs.

<u>Tommy McGowan (Aka Freddy)</u> – Stylish top order batter, great fielder, and medium pace bowler. Freddy was one of our all round performers this season. A confidence player, Freddy looks effortless and stylish when batting confidently and he is also an excellent runner between the wickets. Freddy is a very handy third change bowler capable of bowling some tricky outswing and he's also a great fielder with very safe hands taking 5 catches for the season.

Key Stats: Runs: 109, Ave: 7.27, High Score: 21 (no), Wickets: 5, Best Bowling: 2/8 from 2 overs.

<u>Rhys Gray</u> – Elegant top order batter, great fielder, and accurate medium pace bowler. Rhys was also a great all round performer for the Gold team this summer. Rhys showed great courage early in the season bouncing back quickly after receiving a nasty body blow. Rhys is a stroke maker with great technique and is an awesome runner between the wickets. Rhys was also a good performer with the ball and our third highest wicket taker. Rhys also had the best bowling average for the team this season. Rhys's fielding was also a feature taking 5 catches and affecting 2 run outs. Key Stats: Runs: 119, Ave: 11.90, High Score: 25 (no), Wickets: 9, Best Bowling: 2/12 from 3 overs.

Liam Carter – Stroke making middle order batter and #1 wicket keeper.

Liam had a great season overall this year. After a patchy start with the bat Liam finished the second half of the season in stellar form including scoring the only 50 (not out) made during the season. Liam is a confidence player and dynamic shot maker finding the boundary frequently (27 x4's and 2 x 6's). Liam was our #1 wicket keeper and he had an awesome season behind the stumps taking catches, affecting stumpings and in supporting the fielders in several run outs. When taking a break from behind the stumps Liam was a very handy medium pace change bowler and excellent fielder. Key Stats: Runs: 199, Ave: 14.21, High Score: 50 (no), Catches: 10, Stumpings: 3, Wickets: 1.

Cooper Day (Aka Cooperama) – Opening pace bowler and middle order batter.

Cooperama was our best all-rounder finishing our 3 rd highest run scorer and 4 th highest wicket taker for the season. Cooper was one of our opening bowlers and often troubled the better batters in the Div 1 competition. Cooperama batted reliably and consistently in a range of batting positions and in both 30 over and T20 formats. Cooperama was one of the four players to average more than 10 per innings. Cooperama was also equal top in terms of run outs with three.

Key Stats: Runs: 153, Ave: 10.93, High Score: 27 (no), Wickets: 8, Best Bowling: 2/14 from 5 overs.

<u>Alex Low (Aka Duck)</u> - Versatile batter, deceptive second change bowler and #2 wicket Keeper. Alex is an enthusiastic and always positive team member who absolutely excelled in the field. Alex's ability, effort and presence on the field set the standard for what is needed at the Div 1 level. Alex also had a good season with ball often taking a wicket when coming on to bowl and breaking partnerships. Alex proved his versatility by batting at any position often performing a crucial anchor role in protecting his wicket for lengthy partnerships. Alex also kept wicket in several our matches. Key Stats: Runs: 32, Ave: 2.0, High Score: 5 (no), Wickets: 7, Best Bowling: 2/13 from 3 overs.

<u>Riley Thompson -</u> Lower/middle order batter and 2 nd change bowler. Classic catch specialist Riley joined the team a few matches into the season but settled in very quickly. Without doubt the most memorable and spectacular displays from Riley this season were his catches. Two of them were worthy of the BBL and they certainly astonished the spectators and the "unlucky" batters. At times during the season Riley also took on an important anchor role valuing his wicket and building a partnership with set batters towards the end of the innings. Riley also eliminated the hop from his bowling action which was a real credit to him.

Key Stats: Runs: 28, Ave: 2.55, High Score: 13, Wickets: 2, Best Bowling: 1/13 from 2 overs.

<u>Tommy Jeacocke (Aka Junior)</u> - 1st change or opening bowler, lower order batter Junior had a magnificent year with the ball finishing as our leading wicket taker for the season. Ranging between first change and opening bowler Junior's line and length bowling paid dividends for him this year against quality opposition batters. Enthusiastic and determined, not only with his bowling, Junior's batting confidence grew as the season progressed. Junior also displayed his tenacity through his ability to occupy the crease and support established batters in the latter stages of matches.

Key Stats: Runs: 35, Ave: 2.91, High Score: 13 (no), Wickets: 18, Best Bowling: 3/29 from 5 overs.

<u>Eli Buckmaster (Aka Skeeta)</u> - Adaptable batter (opener), medium pace bowler, great on-field leader Skeeta, one of the elder statesmen of the team, displayed great leadership this season with lots of positive on-field talk and encouragement. Skeeta started the season in the middle order but accepted the challenge of moving to opener mid-season. He showed enormous grit, determination and concentration in adapting to the new role and made his highest scores for the season from the opening position. Skeeta was also a handy partnership breaking bowler during the middle of the opposition's innings and an enthusiastic fielder.

Key Stats: Runs: 114, Ave: 8.77, High Score: 26 (no), Wickets: 5, Best Bowling: 1/9 from 2 overs.

<u>James Allbeury (Aka Sonic)</u> - Big hitting batter, express pace bowler and great fielder Sonic, the other elder statesman of the team, was our opening pace bowler and free hitting middle/lower order batter. Finishing 2nd in total wickets Sonic could often beat batters with pace and bounce and kept our wicket keepers on their toes. A blistering spell in one T20 game saw Sonic capture 4 wickets for 0 runs in two overs including three bowled and one caught behind. Sonic topped the batting strike rate for the team and hit the most 6's for the season (5). A sharp close in fielder Sonic was equal top for run outs for the team with three.

Another season has flown past! With Covid still around and so too plenty of wet weather it was great to still get a decent amount of cricket in after a tricky start.

With our Stage 2 Team, we had a great mix of more experienced players in Sahishna Duggirala, Ash Lockerbie, Elyse Denman and Sanjana Kanchi as well as girls new to hard ball cricket in Lily Mutch-Cantwell, Jhanvi Khanna, Emilia Kelly and Ashni Stephenson.

We built the season slowly with Sahishna, Ash, Elyse and Sanjana leading at the top of the order till the newer girls got more confident facing the hard ball. Same approach with bowling, looking to get the ball as full as possible. It certainly helped show our new girls how to go about their cricket and what would lead to better results both individually and as a team.

The improvement was fantastic with each of the girls retiring with the bat or getting their first wickets and you could see the extra work they put in off the field was paying off. With some of our older girls, starting to break stumps when bowling and hit their first 6s and more boundaries in general. Bravery award goes to Lily who fractured her thumb batting before xmas but came back to finish the season.
